




## JANUARY is VOCATIONAL SERVICE MONTH

January is Vocational Service Month on the Rotary calendar. Vocational Service is at the heart of Rotary, which was founded on the classification system of membership. Business and professional life are the bedrock of Rotary, and Vocational Service is a major force in promoting honour, integrity, and trustworthiness in business.

Of Rotary's five Avenues of Service – Club, Vocational, Community, Youth and International – Vocational is difficult to define, so it is sometimes called the "Forgotten Avenue of Service". One reason is Club, Community, International and Youth Service activities usually involve groups of Rotarians. They enjoy the fellowship of Club Service, the satisfaction of serving the needs of their communities, and the hope that their International Service promotes world peace and understanding. But Vocational Service – the second Avenue of Service –- is generally conducted by individual members.



Rotary's early leaders often cited the Golden Rule – "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" – as the guiding principle of Rotary's Vocational Service. By the time of the first convention in 1910, the networking emphasis had begun to shift. The majority of clubs felt that Rotary should move from being a booster club to improving their communities. The concept of "he profits most who serves his fellows best" became "he profits most who serves best". This idea morphed into "Service, not Self" and finally, it became the Rotary slogan we know today -- "Service Above Self".

In 1940, Rotary International defined the Object of Vocational Service "to encourage and foster: high ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; the dignifying by each Rotarian of his occupation as an opportunity to serve society." Today's Rotarians still pride themselves on being able to use their professional stature and knowledge to make things happen worldwide, wherever there is a need for change.

During this month of Vocational Service, clubs can highlight the importance of the business and professional life of each Rotarian. Vocational Service is at the heart of Rotary, which was founded on the classification system of membership. As a Rotarian, you can put these ideals into action:

- 🖶 Talk about your vocation in your club, and take time to learn about fellow members' vocations.
- Use your professional skills to serve a community.
- Practice your profession with integrity, and inspire others to behave ethically through your own words and actions.
- Help a young person achieve his or her career aspirations.
- **Guide** and encourage others in their professional development.

If you do any of these things, you are performing vocational service. And if vocational service motivates and energizes you, then you're in the right place, because vocational service is the very essence of Rotary. It is what sets Rotary apart from other service organizations.

The **Rotary Vocational Service Excellence Award** is designed to recognize an individual who surpasses expectations for exemplary vocational service. These are employees who go above and beyond to serve others with a positive and willing spirit.


## 2022-2023 Rotary Citation

The club has a large Bursary Fund and every year we donate funds to the Bursary fund of Flamboyant School to enable several students to attend the school and get the support they need in order to be successful at school.

This year, RC White River hosted eight Christmas parties with the help from two local schools by way of gifts for the children at the parties.

We gave gifts to children in a home for children who have been abandoned and are waiting to be fostered, our day care centre for children with disabilities, five homes for orphaned and vulnerable children, a school and also a group of children living with their families in abject poverty just outside White River.
