Message from the District Governor: Dr Stella Anyangwe

D9400 sadly mourns the loss of Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu, a Rotary Paul Harris Fellow, who passed away just after Christmas, at the age of 90 years. We will forever remember and celebrate him as Rotary continues with the Tutudesk Project, in collaboration with the Tutu Foundation. Rest in peace, dear Arch!

The second half of the Rotary Year 2021-22 has started, and in no time at all, the year will be over. I kicked off the year with a visit to Maputo, Mozambique, to confer with, and encourage the Host Organizing Committee of the Maputo Presidential Conference that will take place on 4th-5th March 2022. All systems are in place for the Conference, and I encourage D9400 Rotarians and Rotaractors to register massively, and to take advantage of the "early bird special" registration fee take ends on 31st January. Thereafter, the D9400 Governor-Elect, Koekie Makunyane Quashie, will coordinate the training of club presidents and other club officers (PETS/POETS), as well as the training of Assistant Governors (AGs) and District Committee Chairs. February will be a busy month for us all.

Imagine the possibilities in the change you can make to transform the world.

Incoming RI President Jennifer Jones, of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, revealed the 2022-23 presidential theme, **Imagine Rotary**, as she urged people to dream big and harness their connections and the power of Rotary to turn those dreams into reality. "*Imagine, a world that deserves our best where we get up each day knowing that we can make a difference.*"

The theme graphic was designed by an Australian indigenous artist to link with the Melbourne convention in 2023. Jones explained the **Imagine Rotary** theme as follows:

LOGO:

- Circle - connections to one another
- Dots around it - Our People
- The 7 Dots represent Rotary's 7 areas of focus
- Circle + dots - Navigation star, our guiding light
- Green solid line - digging stick (used when doing hard work); for us it's People of Action, represents the tools for getting things done

COLOURS:

- Purple- Polio
- Green- Environment
- White - Peace
- Celebrate DEI - Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.
- Freedom to express ourselves differently but still with a special connection.
- Represents Empowerment and Newness and
- Also women's movement giving us the opportunity to grow our female membership.

FEBRUARY is PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION MONTH

Peace and conflict resolution and prevention is one of the six areas of focus of Rotary and the theme for the month of February. The month of February is very special in the Rotary calendar because it includes the anniversary of the first meeting of Rotary held on February 23, 1905, now designated as the World Understanding and Peace Day.

The conflicts that occur throughout the world are often the root causes of poverty, despair, economic hardship and poor health. Take for instance the major deterrent to polio eradication: the difficulty in vaccinating children in war torn countries. We also see these conflicts occurring in some form within our own communities with the same results. Rotary International as an organization understands this relationship and therefore is deeply invested in supporting individuals and programs that will develop leaders who are committed to seeking ways toward peace. The path toward peace begins with understanding and respect for the differences that make us unique.

These are the same types of values that are studied in the peace centres supported by Rotary International in association with several major universities across the globe. The mission of these centres is to “empower, educate, and increase the capacity of peace builders through rigorous academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities.

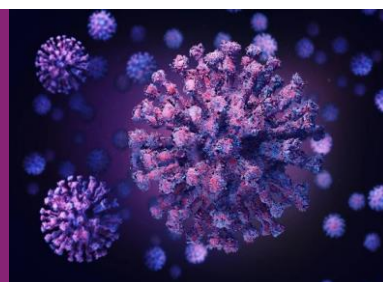
Conflict and violence displace millions of people each year. Half of those killed in conflict are children, and 90 percent are civilians. We refuse to accept conflict as a way of life. Rotary projects provide training that fosters understanding and provides communities with the skills to resolve conflicts. Through our service projects, peace fellowships, and scholarships, our members are taking action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources. I am certain that we will continue his legacy and that of Rotary, by encouraging club members to join the campaigns and projects that aim to **EndPolioNow**, raise funds for the **TutuDesk** campaign, become Peace Fellows and contribute to the overall campaign for the dignity of all peoples. One of its objectives is to forge a path for existing Rotary peace programs, such as the Rotary Peace Fellows, to become involved directly with Rotarians and their activities.

- ✚ To grow more members to the RAGFP from Africa
- ✚ To grow Rotary Peacebuilder Clubs in Africa

The Rotary Club of Brits-Hartbeespoort will facilitate a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) seminar for the youth at Camp Extreme Life @ DIE HOEKIE in Hartbeespoort from 12:00 on **Friday 4 March 2022** to 13:00 on **Sunday 6 March 2022**.

It is an intensive all-expenses-paid camp, to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice. The fee for the camp is R1 100 per participant.

RYLA is an outstanding program, which provides young people of Grade 11 and 12 levels, the opportunity to develop their leadership capabilities. Learners from Grade 10 can, however, join as well. Officially adopted by Rotary International in 1971, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is one of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service. Each year, thousands of young people take part in the program world-wide. Youth Officers of the Rotary Clubs in D9400 are invited to send learners to this event.

The program will involve directed group discussions, debates, practical exercises and lead-in lectures by highly regarded personalities, on subjects such as:

- ❖ Goal setting & prioritising
- ❖ Teambuilding & team work
- ❖ Time management
- ❖ Conflict resolution
- ❖ Integrity & leadership
- ❖ Environmental issues
- ❖ Communication
- ❖ Decision making

RYLA awardees can expect to further develop their personal and leadership skills through lectures, workshops, small and large group discussions as well as the utilisation of films and video tapes as learning aids.

There is also "time out" for team recreational activities and time to get to know other awardees.

The whole camp is coordinated and organised by an active committee comprising a number of Rotarians and past RYLA awardees, all of whom have been screened and comply with the Rotary Youth Protection Policy.

The Rotary Club of Polana organised its first blood donation campaign, as part of its Safe Blood with Regular Donors Project. The project aims to create a database of 100 regular blood donors, who will participate in about four vaccination campaigns in the current Rotary year, as well as educate and raise awareness in the community about the need to donate blood.

The first blood donation campaign took place on December 5, 2021, at the Eduardo Mondlane University Health Center, where 36 units of 500 ml of blood were collected. The campaign was organised in collaboration with the National Blood Department of the Ministry of Health of Mozambique.

Rotary Club of Morningside



The Rotary Club of Morningside got into the spirit of the season inviting shoppers at the Morningside Shopping Centre to support their Christmas food collection. The campaign was the fourth in a series of emergency food relief drives held in 2020 and 2021.

Shoppers could donate loose items of non-perishable food or sponsor a bag of groceries to the value of R99. The bags contained various staples from rice and sugar to soups and pilchards. The shopper's contributions were supplemented by a donation of 225 bags of POWA Pak pap sponsored by Soul Food Africa.

In total, 172 bags of groceries were donated by shoppers, plus a haul of loose items to the total value of R38,000. On 15 December, 120 of the bags were delivered to Oratile Early Childhood Development centre in Diepsloot. From there, individual families came and collected a bag of supplies to see them through the festive season.



The Rotary Club of Krugersdorp joined the Rotary Club of Morningside in the Christmas efforts. In addition to the bags of groceries prepared by RC Morningside for 50 vulnerable families in Munsieville, they donated toiletries. Rotarians also loaded up their vehicles and made the trip out to the disadvantaged community.

Tower of Life Men's Shelter in Krugersdorp had gone into complete lockdown after 10 residents contracted Covid. This meant they had a need for more food supplies, as residents would now need three meals a day. As such, the Rotarians also dropped off a boot-load of the loose food items to help the shelter get through the difficult time.

A team of nine volunteers have made a difference in the lives of severely handicapped cerebral palsy children in Venda. It had taken months of painstaking planning and logistics to source old abandoned Madiba buggies, then strip and refurbish the shells, make new tray tables and footrests, cut and glue foam rubber seats and sew covers.

The beneficiaries of this project were close to the Zimbabwe border - an elderly woman caring for her three-year-old C cerebrally palsied grandchild, whose mother had passed away and a young mother of twins whose son is also cerebrally palsied.

Back in Thohoyandou the team found a further 11 families waiting with their children ranging from toddlers to 21-year-old who were accompanied by their supportive fathers also in need of Madiba buggies.

Besides a sensory toy, each parent was also gifted a beautifully crocheted and knitted blanket.

The Rotary Club of Polokwane delivered wheelchairs to numerous beneficiaries. Mobility is a challenge experienced by most people living with disabilities. Rotary, through the Rotary Foundation, Rotarians and Clubs like the Rotary Club of Polokwane help them to regain their independence, confidence and mobility by donating wheelchairs.



The Rotary Club of Polokwane has always been interested in addressing health issues faced by members of the community it serves in. Mental health is one aspect that the Club feels is overlooked in its communities and there is a need to raise awareness.

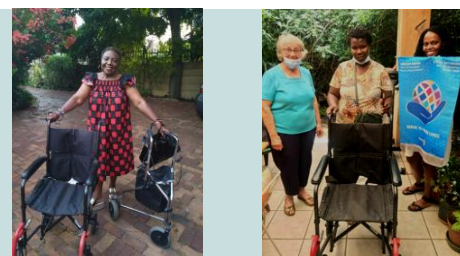
The communities view anxiety, depression, panic attacks and other mental related diseases as taboo which leads many to suffer in silence. As members of these communities, the club saw the need to work with the Kabosadi Disability Centre to engage learners through the use of Duplo resources.

Duplo training sessions were held at the Kabosadi Disability Centre, in the Polokwane village of Ga-Maja. Daily, the learners get to learn creative, communication, problem-solving, critical thinking skills to help them integrate into the societies that they live in. The results have been remarkable and proves that there is no such a thing as "disabled", but differently-abled.

The Rotary Club of Pretoria West has a very strong wheelchair project that has had great success. The club has donated numerous wheelchairs and walkers to those in need. At the recent handover of a wheelchair, the recipient was too ill to be present. The daughter of the person needing the wheelchair was happy to receive it on her behalf.



Through their Peace Fellow project, the Rotary Club of Pretoria Capital has supported student, Chenai Kagundure, to do her Master's degree in peace building at the Peace Centre at the University of North Carolina USA. Chenai is now working in Canada and is instrumental in soon setting up the first International Rotary Club for Peace Fellows and Peace Builders (see D9400 calendar).

The chartering of this world-wide club by an alumni Rotary Peace Fellow is the direct outcome of the RC Pretoria Capital's Peace Fellow project.
