Dear Fellow Rotarians, Rotaractors, Anns and Friends of Rotary of District 9400,

### Humans and the environment

Human life depends and will depend on how humans preserve the environment. Safeguarding the planet by preserving the environment is a task we need to embrace with all our heart.

Conservation of environment natural resources is threatened by humans. Pollution is one of the situations damaging our environment. This is why a very critical issue we need to address is educating communities and the younger generations about the significance of environmental preservation for the continued survival of humanity through supporting education initiatives that promote behaviour conducive to protecting the environment.

Protecting the environment is a way to foster harmony between people and nature. Sadly, we learn about destruction of eco-systems in the name of development, a danger that does not seem that will slow down soon.

Population growth and expansion can cause food shortages, extinction of species, and social or political unrest that threaten the environment. Interactions among populations, animals, and plants can disrupt longstanding environmental systems. Climate change is making the situation worse. In our subregion, extreme weather driven by climate change threatens food and water security and alters disease patterns, underscoring the need for health systems to adapt and protect vulnerable populations. Climate change events are becoming more frequent and intense. Parts of Africa face food and water shortages due to social unrest and climate change, with little hope for improvement.

### Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus

Rotary embraced environmental protection as its 7<sup>th</sup> area of focus aware of the attention this area deserves for the future of mankind. The Rotary Foundation Trustees and Rotary International Board of Directors unanimously approved adding a new area of focus from July 2021 from July 2021: supporting the environment with service activities supported by global grants joining peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment;

### Os seres humanos e o ambiente

A vida humana depende e continuará a depender da forma como os seres humanos preservam o ambiente. Proteger o planeta através da preservação do ambiente é uma tarefa que devemos abraçar de todo o coração.

A conservação dos recursos naturais do ambiente está ameaçada pela acção humana. A poluição é uma das situações que prejudicam o nosso ambiente. É por isso que uma questão

fundamental que precisamos de abordar é a educação das comunidades e das gerações mais jovens sobre a importância da preservação ambiental para a sobrevivência contínua da humanidade, através do apoio a iniciativas educativas que promovam comportamentos favoráveis à protecção do ambiente.

Proteger o ambiente é uma forma de promover a harmonia entre as pessoas e a natureza. Infelizmente, assistimos à destruição de ecossistemas em nome do desenvolvimento, um perigo que não parece que vá abrandar em breve.

O crescimento e a expansão populacionais podem causar escassez de alimentos, extinção de espécies e agitação social ou política que ameaçam o ambiente. As interações entre populações, animais e plantas podem perturbar sistemas ambientais de longa data. As alterações climáticas estão a agravar a situação. Na nossa sub-região, os fenómenos meteorológicos extremos provocados pelas alterações climáticas ameaçam a segurança alimentar e hídrica e alteram os padrões de doenças, sublinhando a necessidade de os sistemas de saúde se adaptarem e protegerem as populações vulneráveis. Os fenómenos relacionados com as alterações climáticas estão a tornar-se mais frequentes e intensos. Algumas partes de África enfrentam escassez de alimentos e água devido à agitação social e às alterações climáticas, com poucas esperanças de melhoria.

### As Sete Áreas de Foco do Rotary

O Rotary adoptou a protecção ambiental como a sua sétima área de foco, consciente da importância que esta área merece para o futuro da humanidade. Os curadores da Fundação Rotária e o Conselho de Administração do Rotary International aprovaram por unanimidade a adição de uma nova área de foco a partir de Julho de 2021: apoiar o meio ambiente com actividades de serviço financiadas por subsídios globais, juntando-se à construção da paz e prevenção de conflitos;

### Quadro social

A huge movement is ongoing mainly in Gauteng aiming at increasing the Rotary Family. Corporates, diplomats and the Academicians have been targeted as prospective members. Increasing giving is the other leg of District efforts.

The incoming District Governor is busy with training, planning and filling the positions for next year.

Rotary is 121 years old and D9400 can proudly say that it hosts the oldest Rotary Club in Africa.

The Rotary Club of Johannesburg was established 105 years ago, on April 25, 1921, and officially chartered on July 1 of that same year with 45 members. The charter president was Herbert Hosken, with a total of six directors. The first meeting venue was the YMCA in Joubert Street, and changed to the Scientific and Technical Club in August 191. From February 1927 to July 1963, the venue changed to the Carlton Hotel.

Thank you to the Rotary Club of Pittsburg through Rotarian Edward C Fischer - today we celebrate 105 years of a conscience decision: To serve our communities and make the world a better place and continue to do so.

### Service and leadership:

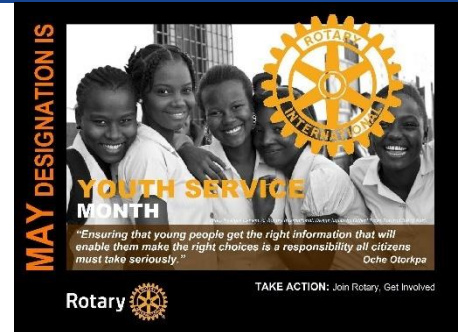
Rotary clubs organize activities to support youth in their service projects and foster leadership skills.

# Women in Rotary

On the 4<sup>th</sup> of May 1987 the US Supreme Court ruled that Rotary Clubs could no longer exclude women from membership on the basis of gender and in **1989 the RI Council on Legislation** standardized all Rotary documents and rules. The 1989 Council on Legislation vote to admit women into Rotary clubs worldwide remains a watershed moment in the history of Rotary.

**Today, women are active participants in Rotary, serving their communities in increasing numbers and serving in leadership positions in Rotary.**

The response to the decision was overwhelming: By June 1990, the number of female Rotarians had skyrocketed to over 20,000. The number of women members worldwide reached 195,000 in July 2010 (about 16% of Rotarians) and surpassed 277,000 in July 2020 (about 23% ). The timeline below highlights historic milestones and senior leadership firsts that have helped build greater diversity in Rotary. These leaders and all our female members are making positive change in communities around the world.

## Timeline of women in Rotary

**1950** An enactment to delete the word “male” from the Standard Rotary Club Constitution is proposed by a Rotary club in India for the Council on Legislation meeting at the 1950 Rotary Convention.

**1964** The Council on Legislation agenda contains an enactment proposed by a Rotary club in Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) to permit women into Rotary clubs. Delegates vote that it be withdrawn. Two other proposals to allow women to be eligible for honorary membership are also withdrawn.

**1972** As more women begin reaching higher positions in their professions, more clubs begin lobbying for female members. A US Rotary club proposes admitting women into Rotary at the 1972 Council on Legislation.

**1977** Three separate proposals to admit women membership are submitted to the Council on Legislation for consideration at the 1977 Rotary Convention. The RC Duarte, California, USA, admits women as members in violation of the RI Constitution and Standard Rotary Club Constitution. Because of this violation, the club’s RI membership is terminated in March 1978. (The club was reinstated in September 1986.)

**1980** The RI Board of Directors and Rotary clubs in India, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United States propose an enactment to remove from the RI and club constitutions and bylaws all references to members as “male persons.”

**1983-86** In a lawsuit filed by RC Duarte, the California Superior Court in 1983 rules in favour of Rotary International, upholding gender-based qualification for membership in California Rotary clubs. In 1986, the California Court of Appeals reverses the lower court’s decision, preventing the enforcement of the provision in California. The California Supreme Court refuses to hear the case, and it is appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court.

**1987** 4 May - US Supreme Court rules that Rotary clubs may not exclude women from membership on the basis of gender. Rotary issues a policy statement that any Rotary club in the United States can admit qualified women into membership.

RC Marin Sunrise, California becomes the first club after the US Supreme Court ruling to have women as charter members. Sylvia Whitlock of RC Duarte, California, becomes the first female Rotary club president.

**1988** November - RI Board of Directors issues a policy statement recognizing the right of Rotary clubs in Canada to admit female members based on a Canadian law similar to that upheld by the US Supreme Court.

**1989** First meeting after 1987 US Supreme Court decision, Council on Legislation votes to eliminate the requirement in RI Constitution that membership in Rotary clubs be limited to men. Women are welcomed into Rotary clubs around the world.

**1990** As of June, there are about 20,200 female Rotarians worldwide. *The Rotarian* runs a feature on women in Rotary.

**1995** July - Eight women become district governors.

**2005** Carolyn E. Jones - first woman appointed as trustee of The Rotary Foundation.

**2008** Catherine Noyer-Riveau - first woman elected to RI Board of Directors.

**2012** Elizabeth S. Demaray - first woman to serve as RI treasurer.

**2013** Anne L. Matthews - first woman to serve as RI vice president.

**2019** Brenda Marie Cressey - first woman to serve as vice-chair of The Rotary Foundation. In April-June 2019 she becomes the first woman to serve as TRF chair.

**2022** Jennifer Jones - first female president of Rotary International.

## A LIFETIME OF IMPACT

PDG Stella Anyangwe has been recognised for *A Lifetime of Impact* by the **Pan African Women Organisation**. Her work in Africa spans decades, including as a World Health Organisation representative in multiple countries. She has continued to take up leadership positions in the fight to eradicate polio through her prominent role in Rotary as the EndPolioNow Coordinator for 15 countries in eastern and southern Africa from 2022 to 2025.

Her career reflects sustained commitment to strengthening health systems and advancing public health outcomes. As a medical doctor with an MPH and PhD in Epidemiology, she initially taught at a medical school in Cameroon, equipping doctors with the skills needed for effective prevention and control of prevalent communicable and non-communicable diseases.

PDG Stella’s work led to a position at the World Health Organisation to support polio eradication in the Africa region where she developed guidelines for district microplanning used in supplemental polio immunisation programmes.

She later became the WHO Country Representative, coordinating efforts to strengthen national health systems served in Seychelles, Mali, Zambia and South Africa as well as chair of the UN Country Coordinating Mechanism for the Global Fund for HIV/AIDS, TB and Malaria.

Her 30-year association with Rotary International began in 1995. Since then, she has served as a Rotarian, club president, assistant governor and in 2021, the district governor of Rotary District 9400. PDG Stella is a pioneer and example to all women in Rotary.

## International ICC dialogue for peace and community partnerships



The Inter-Country Committees Connections 2026 (ICC) international event organized by Rotary International in Cluj-Napoca in northwestern Romania, brought together participants from 17 countries and 230 members from more than 60 Rotary clubs.



The ICC Connections set the stage for the signing of an MOU between D9400 and D2241 (Romania and Moldova). Discussions highlighted the importance of collaboration across borders and sitting together in dialogue, choosing conversation over conflict, and partnership over isolation. Sharing best practices in key areas like education, health, urban development, environmental protection and support for vulnerable communities. Thus, the context is formed in which ideas become partnerships, and partnerships transform into concrete projects and results.

The "Pillar of Peace" is engraved with the message: "May peace prevail on Earth", a symbol of the desire for peace around the world and cooperation between people.*
